1928 License Badges

Just four celluloid badges were issued in 1928, the first year when hunters and anglers were required to wear readily identifiable badges in the field. As mentioned, paper licenses (with matching serial numbers) were also required to be carried. Different vignettes were used for the different types of licenses (a rabbit for the small game badge and a buck head for deer) and different colors were used to distinguish resident from non-resident for each type.

1928 Resident Small Game



In 1928, resident small game licenses cost \$1.25 and 317,622 were sold.

In 1928, resident deer licenses cost \$2.50 and In 1928, non-resident deer licenses cost \$50 58,742 were sold.
